There is a third option though. In the summer of 2013 MAF staff in Kalimantan, Indonesia officially opened the doors of "Rumah Singgah" or "The Hospital House." The purpose of the house is to provide both housing and hospitality to the families of those who have been flown by MAF into the area from the surrounding villages for medical treatment. *It allows Jesus' love to be experienced even after the airplane lands.* The house is only a stone's throw away from the hospital, and MAF staff maintain the home to ensure that the families have everything they need during their stay. While the above scenario is technically fiction, it rings true for many in that area who have been helped by MAF through medical evacuations and through the opportunity to stay at "Rumah Singgah."
