All of this training accumulates in the fall on the extended cross country, in which I will experience flying in the mountains of Washington, Idaho, Oregon and Utah; and the opportunity to fly long distances all the way to the southern tip of California all in a two week long trip. I am nervous however for the upcoming instrument training in order to receive my instrument flight rating, or IFR. During this training a lot of new information needs to be learned on top of rigorous training that requires precise aircraft skill and includes lots of new information. It will be a great experience and I am glad to have the opportunity to be involved in it, and grow through it.
